



TSPS Debating - How does the TSPS debating team work?

Being a part of Truscott Street's debating team has been an incredible honour and enjoyable time. We start off as someone eager to try out and 6 students from Stage 3 get chosen. We have numerous debating meetings during lunch which help us get prepared for our debates against various schools. Some of these debates may be online due to Covid-19 but we also have a chance to visit these schools and host some of them as well. Our debates are rather professional, with a qualified adjudicator (the one who decides who wins) assessing our speeches and rebuts. These adjudicators change every time. We receive tips on how to improve and use the suggestions for the next rounds. An exemplary performance in these debates could bring us to the finals and win us first place. This year our team came second and extremely close to the top spot.

We went to the debate scared. We were at the debate scared. We came back elated.

It was the 17th of August and it was time for Round 4 of the Premier's Debating Challenge. We arrived at Ryde Public School near Top Ryde Mall feeling excited but at the same time nervous. We had to win the debate to have a chance at the final, so there was inevitably some pressure.

The three topics we had to choose from were. Contact sports should be banned for children, We should never separate boys and girls in sports. After a long brainstorming session, our final arguments were:


- Gender equality
