Anaphylaxis

Like most schools we have several students who live with the risk of anaphylaxis to various foods. We ask that you help us support these students by educating your child on the importance of not sharing food with others

Peanuts are the leading cause of severe allergic reactions, followed by tree nuts, shellfish, egg, fish and milk. We can never totally eliminate the risk of anaphylaxis, nor claim to be a nut free school, but we can all do things that will help minimise the risk. Please consider children with food allergies when packing your own child's lunch or when sending in food for any special occasion or events. We ask that you do not send peanut butter sandwiches or food containing peanut butter, any nuts or foods containing whole nuts such as muesli bars.

Menstrual Hygiene Program comes to Truscott Street Public School

The NSW Department of Education has introduced a menstrual hygiene program in NSW public schools.

Our menstrual hygiene program aims to reduce any barriers that may prevent students from participating fully in school life. Menstruation (and its unpredictability) may stop students from attending school or taking part in learning activities. There are also known health risks from using improvised sanitary hygiene products.

As part of the program, our school now has dispensers that provide free pads and tampons for students to access during school hours.


